Received a call from Angie Smith with the Alabma EMA regarding a train collision occurring at the CSXT - Boyles Terminal off of Seaboard Road in Birmingham, Jefferson County. The incident occurred when two trains collided. The results of this collision was the release of approximately 18,100 gallons of lubration oil onto the ballast of the rail yard. No material was observed in any adjacent waters of the state.

Arcadis Environmental Services was onsite as general environmental consultants for the incident. HEPACO and Marion Environemental, Inc. were onsite to perform source removal and respone activities, including the following: percautionary boom placement in nearby drainage areas and creek outfalls, the construction of two, 6-inch trench drain pipes, and 6 vac trucks in rotation performing continuous oil recovery at the ballast, and the reconaissance of boom and waterways every 3-hours. As of April 9, 2018, 20,800 gallons of water and product have been recovered. Inspection and recovery events have been scheduled for approximately every-other-day or immediately following storm events. Inspection and recovery events are ongoing.

The release was not ongoing, and the slick was contained within the drain with booms by the fire department.
