You Will Need a Food Permit from the Health Department to Sell Food

- If you plan to sell anything along any of the properties surrounding Legion Field, you must get permission from the property owner to sell goods on their property.
- Food trucks or push carts that have annual mobile food permits from Jefferson County (or any other county in Alabama as long as the permitted commissary is less than 100 miles from Legion Field) may operate without any additional health permits as long as they return to their commissaries at the end of each day.
- If you are a property owner (or organizer) who will have food vendors on their property, <u>and</u> vendors will only be allowed to operate for <u>less than 24 hours</u> (measured from the beginning of service to the end of clean-up), you may apply for an event exemption by submitting the Application for Exemption with the \$150 application fee. Be advised: The event sponsor is responsible for making sure all vendors listed on the application adhere to the event date(s) and the 24-hour time frame provided on the application. Furthermore, food vendors must still adhere to the Temporary Food Establishment Requirements.
- Vendors who will operate for <u>more than 24 hours</u> (measured from the beginning of service to the end of clean-up) or if the organizer chooses <u>not</u> to apply for an exemption, the vendor must apply for a temporary food permit by completing the Vendor Application and submitting the \$100 application fee.
